Rector's Rambling

This morning we hear of the healing of the man who was deaf, and had an impediment of

speech. Jesus performs the healing with the command *Ephphatha*, which means "be opened".

This reading, and that phrase, holds a special place in the heart of St. John's. For over 100 years, St. John's was the host of the Ephphatha Episcopal Mission of Detroit.

According an article in the February, 1919, edition of the magazine, "The Silent Worker: a magazine for the deaf by the deaf', the mission to the deaf at St. John's began in 1877. Originally meeting at Grace Church on Jefferson (now closed), by summer of 1877, the mission moved to St. John's, and continued her ministry here until the 1970s.

By the 1920s St. John's had seven Sunday services, two of which were held in sign language. At 11:00 AM, while the rest of the congregation worshipped in the main sanctuary, the Ephphatha Mission worshiped in the chapel. In the afternoon there was also a 3:00 PM Evening Prayer service. Many of the staff and members were graduates of the Michigan School for the Deaf in Flint, which continues to this day.

By the 1970s, the mission's congregation size had dwindled, and those few remaining members attended the larger congregational service with a sign language interpreter instead of having a separate service. In 2001, the last remaining

member of the congregation, Elizabeth Prescont Weber Walker, died. She had been wife and granddaughter of two of St. John's Senior Wardens.

Communion Procedure

The Episcopal House of Bishops, in a 1979 teaching, lays out the following guideline for non-Episcopalians to receive communion in an Episcopal Church: The persons should 1) have been Baptized with water in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, 2) believe Christ is present in the sacrament, 3) have been admitted to Holy Communion in their own denomination, and 4) are attempting, by God's grace, to live in love and charity with their neighbor. If you have any questions, please speak to the priest.

To receive the Host, raise your crossed hands, right palm over left. You may also receive directly on the tongue. If you do not wish to receive the Cup, cross your arms over your chest and wait for the chalice bearer to

pass by.

If you are not receiving communion, you still may come forward to the rail, cross your arms over your chest, and receive a blessing.

If you are physically unable to approach the rail, please inform an usher and the Sacrament will be brought to you.

Pastoral Care

Please inform the clergy if you or a family member are ill, hospitalized, or unable to attend the regular worship of the Church so that a pastoral visit can be Please contact the clergy to discuss arrangements for baptisms, weddings, or burials before any announcement or other plans are made.

Outreach

Every Sunday: Food or clothing may be deposited in the basket at the entrance of the church to aid the neighborhood ministry to the poor through Crossroads.

First Sunday of the month: The loose offerings collected are given to support the mission work of the Church in Malawi, Central Africa. Please add a cash gift or extra check in the collection plate every first Sunday of the month!

St. John's Teaching Notes

Not just for worship!

In 1925, the Annual Parish Report notes that during a week's time the old Parish Hall building hosted over 800 people for Sunday School for Youth Adults, classes for a local Armenian congregation, sports groups (it had a gym) and even the YWCA was founded at and hosted in our building.

This tradition continues today. Our building is used for meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous four days a week. Local Homeowners Associations meet here as do some of our Outreach Giving partners such as Keep Growing Detroit, who has meetings here and uses our kitchen to prepare meals for events at their location.

Various college "alternative spring break" groups use our building for housing as they do social service work in the community. The 13th District Republican Committee meets here and we hosted the 13th District Democrats here in the recent past as well.

Some outside groups have come and gone. Proliteracy Detroit met here for years until they moved into a new larger office space with room for training. There was a home school co-op meeting here for a period of time, as well as an autism support group.

Other groups that have used the building have included NFL films – as their offices during the Super Bowl, various movie and TV commercial crews - for feeding and preparations, and local elected officials for town hall meetings.

Also of note is that due to its outstanding acoustics, the sanctuary was used a few years ago to record a portion of the gospel choir background music vocals for the highly successful Chrysler "Imported from Detroit" commercials. We also host concerts for a variety of performing arts groups such as the Detroit Concert Choir and Cass Tech High School Chorus.

We maintain our buildings not only for our use for worship, education, and fellowship on Sundays, but also as an outreach ministry and service tool to the community around us.

We are grateful for the goodly heritage of our facilities, and for your generous support of their upkeep.
