Rector's Rambling

As we continue our way through Advent, we are looking forward to the return of Jesus Christ in glorious maj-

esty to judge the living and the dead, and as the weeks of Advent progress we can't help but focus more sharply on the upcoming celebration of His first coming as an infant in the manger in Bethlehem.

Back in March we celebrated Jesus' Incarnation when He took human flesh in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary, She received the good news from the Archangel Gabriel that this conception would be by the Holy Ghost Himself. We look with anticipation to the celebration of His birth with great joy!

But we still have some Advent left to go and we look to the state of our souls as if Jesus may return today, or we may go to meet Him through our own bodily death. Either way we must be prepared!

In this newsletter there is not only the

Christmas worship schedule but also the things leading up to it like the Advent Soup Luncheon and Greening of the Church. The Warm Fuzzy Tree is ready to receive your gifts of hats, gloves, sweaters, and socks (and thank you for your support of the Giving Tree and St. Catherine's Guild Pantry Sale).

Looking further ahead, God willing, to 2026 we see the celebration of The Epiphany on January 6th, The Annual Parish Meeting on January 25th, The Feast of the Presentation on February 2nd, and on February 15 we welcome Bishop Wendell Gibbs for a celebration of the 25th anniversary of Fr. Kelly's arrival as Rector of St. John's.

Being mindful of First Things First, let us be sure to be in Church this Sunday for worship! And please invite your friends and neighbors to join us Sundays, Holy Days, and the variety of special events offered here at St. John's this season and throughout the year.

AROUND THE PROPERTY @ St. JOHN'S

Things have been very busy at St. John's this summer and fall, when it comes to capital improvements. After our big project of the Ministry Center and Undercroft renovations in 2018 and 2019 we have been mostly doing smaller spot projects here and there as needed. In 2025

we tackled several bigger projects.

One project that the vestry has been attentive to this year has been improving the visibility of St. John's buildings through improved signage. Although it is hard to imagine that people don't notice this grand stone building, there are several things we have done to increase recognition. The faded stat historic sign was replaced with updated language. The electronic signboard, which had become faded on the south side through sun exposure, was not only repainted but also the electronic portion upgraded so that we can put photographs onto it. People walking or driving by can now peek into the inside of the church via the signboard!

Other signage that has been upgraded includes the new lighted signs on the sides of the ministry center which is highly visible to those in Brush Park, driving by on the freeway, and those walking to and from Comerica Park or Ford Field. A very large "St. John's" also now adorns the Woodward belltower door which is a striking sight to those on the Fisher Service Drive and Woodward Avenue. Additionally a service schedule sign and chapel entrance sign now adorns the north side of the church for those walking to and from parking for events at Little Caesars Arena and the stadiums. Future visibility work, God willing, will include improved exterior lighting.

Roofing repairs were also made this fall, correcting a few spots where slate tile came lose, and in the ridgecap at the top of the building above where an occasional puddle would form in the church center aisle.

The front doors of the church, which receive a great deal of direct afternoon sunlight, were stripped and refinished.

The alarm system and video monitoring system have also been upgraded.

In 2026 we hope to do a major upgrade to the electrical system in the Church and Chapel, which was last overhauled in 1936 when the building was moved 60 feet to widen Woodward Avenue.

Daily Bible Reading

Advent is the beginning of the Church new year, and very shortly the calendar new year will be upon us as well. And with that comes New Years Resolutions!

In addition to the regular litany of "lose weight, stick to a new diet, and exercise more" there are some great things you can do for your spiritual fitness and health!

- 1) Attend Holy Communion EVERY Sunday, and also on weekdays when possible. Nothing better then the grace of receiving Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and being obedient in keeping holy the Sabbath by coming to church.
- 2) Pray EVERY day. Whether it is the full prayer book daily office, or 10 minutes set aside to talk to God (preferably both), checking in with the Lord we love is vital!
- 3) Ask Jesus EVERY day how He would have you live and seek to do it.
- 4) Read the Bible EVERY day

Here are a two suggestions for a Bible Reading Program


The first is to use The Daily Lectionary, with are the lessons listed for Morning and Evening Prayer. This is 4 short sections of the Old and New Testment each day. Read them with the Daily Office in the prayer book, or just read them alone.

The second suggestion is to use a A "Through the Bible" podcast which starts on Day 1 with The first lines of Genesis and works its way through the bible each day. These are generally 20 to 30 minutes long, although honestly I listen to them on 1.25 or 1.5 speed so that I can hear it on my ride from my home to the Church in the morning.

I have two suggested podcasts for this.

The first is The Bible in a Year from Ascension Press. I am now finishing my third time through this course and I find it enlightening and even entertaining at times.





The second recommendation is The Bible with Nicky and Pippa Gumbel. Fr. Gumbel is best known from his leadership of The Alpha Course, which we have done several times here at St. John's.

Both of these can be found on most podcast services on Apple and Android phones, or listened to directly from their websites as well. THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT
