Rector's Rambling

Welcome to the Church New Year. Since our Lord has not returned in the past 12 months, we

begin once again the cycle of the liturgical calendar, which starts with the season of Advent.

This is not a season of pre-Christmas, although there is an theological aspect of looking at the prophecies foretelling the coming of a Saviour. I have come to accept that the local radio channels will start playing Christmas Music on November 1, whether I agree or not, and even that some of that music may leak into my house as well. But theologically the church is not there yet.

We begin the year with what, I am sure I will mention in the sermon, is the observance of the "already and not yet". We are looking back at that which has already happened, the fulfillment of God to the people of Israel to send a Saviour. That Saviour, of course, is Jesus Christ. We know that God is faithful in fulfilling his promises, and looking back we can

see that He has done just that.

Convinced that God is faithful in keeping His promises, we will also be looking at the "not yet" of Jesus' return in glorious majesty to judge both the quick and the dead (as we say every week in the Nicene Creed). Jesus is coming back, as He promised, and a part of the Advent observance is making sure that we are both convinced that He is Lord, and more personally that He is our own Lord, and that we are prepared spiritually to meet him. That means we are striving to be in a "state of grace" by repenting of our sins and seeking to follow Him and live as He would have us live.

So Happy New Year! Perhaps a resolution or two are in order? More disciplined about daily prayer, attendance at Church every Sunday unless hindered by illness or only the most urgent matter, attending a Mass during the week or Evening Prayer on Wednesday at St. John's, reaching out to others to share your love for Our Lord and His Church—these are all great ways to get off to a good start in the new Church year!

Communion Procedure

The Episcopal House of Bishops, in a 1979 teaching, lays out the following guideline for non-Episcopalians to receive communion in an Episcopal Church: The persons should 1) have been Baptized with water in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, 2) believe Christ is present in the sacrament, 3) have been admitted to Holy Communion in their own denomination, and 4) are attempting, by God's grace, to live in love and charity with their neighbor. If you have any questions, please speak to the priest.

To receive the Host, raise your crossed hands, right palm over left. You may also receive directly on the tongue. If you do not wish to receive the Cup, cross your arms over your chest and wait for the chalice bearer to

pass by.

If you are not receiving communion, you still may come forward to the rail, cross your arms over your chest,

and receive a blessing.

If you are physically unable to approach the rail, please inform an usher and the Sacrament will be brought to you.

Pastoral Care

Please inform the clergy if you or a family member are ill, hospitalized, or unable to attend the regular worship of the Church so that a pastoral visit can be Please contact the clergy to discuss arrangements for baptisms, weddings, or burials before any announcement or other plans are made.

Outreach

Food may be deposited in the basket at the entrance of the church to aid the neighborhood ministry to the poor through Crossroads and Georgia Street Commu-

There is no better habit to start than that of praying the Daily Office! The Daily Office was designed so that *everyone* could be praying at home or at Church. You will need a 1928 Book of Common Prayer (BCP, available from the ushers) and a Bible, and optionally a copy of each week's Chronicle to follow the appointed daily lessons (called a Lectionary, which is also in the BCP).
