- Children are most welcome at St. John's worship services. For those who desire it, during the school year, Sunday School begins at 10:00 AM in the undercroft, where nursery care is also available year-round.

#### Notes on Selected Portions of Today's Music

#### The Organ Voluntaries:

Today's Prelude and Postlude are taken from Messiaen's *L'Ascension*, a four-movement suite for Ascension Day. The work was composed for orchestra in 1933, and arranged for solo organ a year later. The Prelude ("Prayer of Christ") is the final movement of the suite. It paints the image of Christ praying quietly as he ascends peacefully to heaven where he will become reunited with his Father. The Postlude ("Outbursts of joy") was composed specifically for the organ version of 1934, where it replaced the third movement of the orchestral version. It is an explosive toccata expressing Christ's ecstatic joy as he ascends in glory to join his Father.
